Organize student awardees into a work schedule for the 2013 meeting to assist Allen Press and WSSA with the coordination of the annual meeting.
- <u>List the committee's accomplishments (through January, 2012)</u>: Solicited applications for the Graduate Student Travel Grant to attend the 2012 annual meeting in Hawaii. Conducted search, selected candidates, and continued to work with Allen Press to distribute the awards to graduate students. Organize student awardees into a work

schedule for the 2012 meeting to assist Allen Press and WSSA with the coordination of the annual meeting.

2012-2013 Plan for Committee Activities

- <u>Other Goals for 2013</u>: In progress of planning new goals. To be developed at the 2013, WSSA annual meeting. Symposium on graduate student transition into the work force.
- <u>Plan of Action</u>: Develop an outline and plan for the symposium. Compile a list of speakers to discuss the transition into the workforce.
- <u>Develop a 3-5</u> year schedule of membership support or training symposia. Membership development and symposia materials can be shared via the WSSA webspace (or through other media) to reach the membership as well as at the annual meeting.

Recommendations for Board/Society Action:

- <u>Funds requested for 2013</u>: Underwriting of the Graduate Student Travel Award. Request that Allen Press assist with advertising the Award, with Award logistics, and with the budget associated with administering the award.
- <u>Other requests for the Board</u>: Sponsoring a "Weed scientist speed dating" event. This event would allow students and new professionals to meet and question more seasoned members of the WSSA on how they positioned themselves for a career in weed science. The event will involve tables of WSSA professionals from across the membership to meet individual or small groups of students and new professionals for 10 minutes. During this short exchange, the parties will describe their career aspirations and the professionals will explain how they came to be in their current position as well as any career or professional advice.

Both parties will make a list of the weed scientists they spoke to and who they would like to continue the career conversation. This can take place at the WSSA, for a meal/coffee/during breaks, over email, phone, or another outlet. The professionals pledge to one meeting or a few emails, or phone calls. The students pledge to respect the professionals and their time.

The event should take place earlier in the WSSA meeting week. People attending must sign up for the event in advance.
