The Board members of the Canadian Weed Science Society continued to meet via conference on a regular basis throughout this past year. We were very fortunate to be able to hire Anita Drabyk from Manitoba as our new executive assistant. Her term of service was initiated just a couple of months prior to our annual meeting. Needless to say, her learning curve was very steep, but she very successfully fulfilled her duties to our Society. Our Society held its annual conference in Banff, Alberta from November 24<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup>, 2008. The Board met prior to the conference for a day of strategic planning.
