A Message from the Chairs



Welcome to the 2022 joint Weed Science Society of America (WSSA) and Canadian Weed Science Society (CWSS) annual meeting as we return in-person to the Sheraton Vancouver Wall Centre in Canada. Our 4-star hotel is located in the heart of Vancouver with English Bay Beach, Stanley Park, and numerous shopping/market venues within a few miles.

Our program includes a few significant changes so please read carefully as your arrival and departure date may vary slightly from past events.

The first major change occurs with our WSSA committee chairs conducting their meetings virtually prior to the annual meeting thereby eliminating Monday morning committee meetings (WSSA chairs, have your report to President Dille (dieleman@ksu.edu) no later than Feb. 18, 2022). CWSS committee chairs, your reports will be presented at your general meeting on Nov. 23, 2021.

The second major change will be that our tours, a wine and farm tour as well as a Capilano Suspension Bridge tour, will occur Thursday afternoon, Feb. 24 from 12:30 to 4:30 pm. Make sure to arrange your trip allowing participation for a full day of events on Thursday.

The general session and WSSA/CWSS Awards Ceremony will begin at 4 pm Monday Feb. 21 featuring two plenary speakers. Beekeeper Conrad Bérubé will share his first-hand experience dispatching the first Asian giant hornet nest discovered in North America and Dr. Steve Novak will share lessons learned from the long-running battle with cheatgrass in the Pacific Northwest. Presidents Anita Dille (WSSA) and Marie-Josée Simard (CWSS) will collaborate on the presidential address followed by the presentation of our annual awards. A joint reception will follow to celebrate our award winners.

First thing Tuesday morning at 7 am, a puff run down to the beach and back will take place for exercise enthusiasts. Following tradition, poster session will occur Tuesday and Wednesday mornings along with concurrent breakout sessions providing scientific data of interest for everyone from Tuesday morning through Thursday at lunch.

As always, our meeting is focused heavily on our students. WSSA students will compete Tuesday morning in the 3-MT contest with those making it to the final round speaking again Wednesday morning. For the CWSS contest, students will present Tuesday afternoon. From 6 to 8 pm Tuesday evening, students will tour the Vancouver Art Gallery. On Wednesday, the WSSA student business meeting begins at 11:30 AM followed immediately by the WSSA/CWSS student lunch at 12:30 PM. At the conclusion of lunch, WSSA Enrichment Scholarship winners and our two Science Policy fellows will share their experiences. And finally, at approximately 4:45 pm on Wednesday, presentation and poster contest winners will be recognized followed by a joint WSSA/CWSS celebration.

A Message from the Chairs Continued

The Women in Weed Science Networking Event is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday from 11:30 AM to 1:30 PM with all female conference attendees welcome to attend, just sign up when you register.

Four symposiums will occur from Tuesday through Thursday including the following:

- North America Kochia Committee: Priorities for Coordinating Research, Communication, and Outreach, organized by Todd Gaines and Charles Geddes
- Biological Weed Management – Challenges and Opportunities, organized by Jared Bell, Roger Gast, and Dilpreet Riar.
- Showcasing ARS Weed Science Research – From the Nearly Retired to the Newly Hired, organized by Steve Young and Steve Duke
- The Current Regulatory and Legal Environment for Weed Control Products, organized by Peter Eure and Carroll Moseley

Also for the first-time, we will virtually live-stream the general ceremony and awards along with the announcements of our student contest award winners. Members clearly documented in our survey that they preferred an in-person annual meeting but, understandably, some members simply will not be able to make the trip. Thus, we wanted everyone to have the opportunity to join two of our most important events. 

Nearby Activities & Attractions



Policy Against Harassment at Conferences

Statement of Policy

The Weed Science Society of America (WSSA) is dedicated to providing a harassment-free experience for everyone at WSSA events. WSSA seeks to provide a conference environment in which diverse attendees may learn, network and enjoy the company of colleagues in a professional atmosphere. WSSA does not tolerate harassment of attendees in any form. Use of sexual or discriminatory language and imagery is not appropriate for any WSSA event. Violators of this Event Anti-Harassment Policy may be sanctioned or expelled from the event at the discretion of the WSSA event organizers.

Definition of Harassment

Harassment is verbal, written or physical conduct that denigrates or shows hostility or aversion toward an individual because of their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, national origin, age, disability, marital status, citizenship, genetic information, military status or any other characteristic protected by law or that of relatives, friends or associates. Harassing conduct includes but not limited to deliberate intimidation or hostile acts; stalking; following; harassing photography or recording; sustained disruption of talks or other events; and inappropriate physical contact. Attendees asked to stop any harassing behavior are expected to comply immediately.

Definition of Sexual Harassment

Sexual harassment constitutes discrimination and is illegal under federal, state and local laws. Sexual harassment refers to verbal, physical, and visual conduct of a sexual nature that is unwelcome and offensive to the recipient. By way of example, sexual harassment may include such conduct as sexual flirtations, advances, or propositions; verbal comments or physical actions of a sexual nature; sexually degrading words used to describe an individual; an unwelcome display of sexually suggestive objects or pictures; sexually explicit jokes; and offensive, unwanted physical contact such as patting, pinching, grabbing, groping, or constant brushing against another's body. Attendees asked to stop any sexually harassing behavior are expected to comply immediately.

Scope of Policy

This Anti-Harassment Policy applies to all attendees at WSSA events, including participants, guests, staff, contractors, and exhibitors. All attendees are expected to comply with this Event Anti-Harassment Policy at all event venues and event-related social events.

Reporting an Incident

If you are being harassed, notice that someone else is being harassed, or have any other concerns, please contact an WSSA staff member immediately. WSSA staff can be identified by the official staff badge which is white with the blue and green WSSA logo, their name and title. All complaints will be treated seriously and will be investigated promptly. WSSA staff will be happy to help attendees contact venue security or local law enforcement, provide escorts, or otherwise assist those experiencing harassment to feel safe for the duration of the event. Additional information on reporting an incident at a specific event can be found below.

Disciplinary Action

All reports of harassment will be directed immediately to the WSSA's Conference leadership team who may consult with and engage other WSSA staff, leaders and legal counsel as appropriate. Event security and/or local law enforcement may be involved, as appropriate based on the specific circumstances. In response to a report of harassment, the WSSA Conference leadership team or WSSA staff may take any action they deem appropriate. Such actions range from a verbal warning to ejection from the event without a refund. Repeat offenders may be subject to further disciplinary action, such as being banned from participating in future WSSA conferences or events.

Reporting Procedure

Individuals who believe they have been the victims of conduct prohibited by this policy or believe they have witnessed such conduct should discuss their concerns with Eric Gustafson, WSSA Executive, any WSSA staff, or any member of the WSSA Executive Committee, concerns can be transmitted electronically via info@wssa.net. Weed Science Society of America encourages the prompt reporting of complaints or concerns so that rapid and constructive action can be taken before relationships become irreparably strained. Therefore, while no fixed reporting period has been established, early reporting and intervention have proven to be the most effective method of resolving actual or perceived incidents of harassment.

- Design and implementation of effective integrated weed management systems with private pest management consulting firms

- Research, product development, sales, and marketing with companies specializing in weed management in croplands, aquatic habitats, parks, and urban areas

To prepare for a career in weed science, you typically need a bachelor's degree in agronomy, biochemistry, biology, chemistry, ecology, horticulture, plant physiology, soil science, or a related field. For a research position in academia or industry, an advanced degree is required.
