Dear WSSA and CWSS/SCM members,

The 54th annual meeting of the Weed Science Society of America will be held at the Hyatt Regency Vancouver beginning Monday, February 3 through Thursday, February 6, 2014. This year WSSA is holding a joint meeting with the Canadian Weed Science Society/Société canadienne de malherbologie (CWSS/SCM), which will enhance the program for both societies. The hotel, located in the Vancouver city center with many interesting shops, restaurants, and other attractions, is a great venue for our annual meeting.

WSSA Program Chair Joe DiTomaso and CWSS Program Chair Hugh Beckie have been working together for over a year to coordinate the meetings of our two societies into one seamless event. There will be a very interesting general session and awards presentation Monday afternoon, followed by a society reception. There is a single registration fee to attend the conference. For those of you arriving early, there will be two preconference tours Sunday afternoon, February 2. One is a British Columbia Wine Tour and the other will visit the Botanical Garden at the University of British Columbia. Details on these tours can be found elsewhere in this brochure. The first will be Tuesday afternoon and is entitled "Turf Wars and the Emergence of Pesticide Bans in Canada and the U.S." This symposium was organized by Jenny Kao-Kniffin and Andy Senesac. There will be two symposia on Wednesday afternoon: the first, organized by David Clements, is entitled "Vulnerability of the Pacific Northwest to Plant Invasions;" the second, organized by Steve Duke and Franck Dayan, is entitled "Bioherbicides: Current Status and the Future Prospects." There will also be a symposium on Thursday morning entitled "Addressing Global

Herbicide Resistance Issues – Industry Perspectives and Initiatives," organized by Mark Peterson, John Soteres, and Harry Strek.

The entire program will be posted on the WSSA web site (www.wssa.net) in advance of the meeting. Printed programs will be mailed to those U.S. attendees pre-registered before January 10, 2014. Please be sure to bring your program with you to the meeting - only Canadian, international attendees and on-site registrants will receive programs at the meeting registration desk. Make your travel plans now for what promises to be an excellent meeting! And, for non-Canadian attendees, don't forget your passport!

Both tours leave the hotel at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday Feb. 2. Please be sure to eat lunch prior to departure as lunch will not be included in the tours and food is not allowed on the busses. A tour may be cancelled if there is insufficient interest to cover bus costs – full refunds will be issued to individuals for tour fees already paid. For tours that are not cancelled, no refunds will be issued after December 31 to individuals wishing to cancel their space.

Winery Tour

This tour will visit three British Columbia wineries – all located in Langley, BC – the Vista D'Oro Winery; the Domaine de Chaberton Winery; and the Krause Berry Farms (fruit wines). At Krause Berry Farms there will be pie and ice cream served in addition to the wine tasting. There will also be a brief talk by a grower on weed issues.

Botanical Garden at the University of British Columbia (UBC)

This tour includes the Greenheart Canopy Walk in addition to the rest of the gardens. The Greenheart Canopy Walkway is a 308-metre (1010 feet) aerial trail system that offers a rare perspective of the natural beauty of the west coast forest canopy ecosystem. It is the only one of its kind in Canada. What is a canopy walkway? The aerial trail system allows for interpretation of the tree canopy, providing dynamic new research and learning possibilities. And it's a lot of fun! Canopy walkways allow access to the upper parts of the forest (the canopy) where visitors are introduced to a world of flora and fauna that thrives in this lofty environment. Guests traverse bridges suspended around 50 feet in trees that are over a century old.

Workshop

Use of Linear and Nonlinear Regression in Physical, Chemical and Biological Weed Control Instructors: Jens Carl Streibig¹, Christian Ritz¹ & Andrew R. Kniss²

Uncertainty happens and we must use statistics to determine how closely data correspond to working hypotheses. Whether you publish in international journals or at local meetings, you present effects of treatments, and you are expected to present statistical analyses to substantiate your results. If you have ever wondered when to use analyses of variance or regressions then this course is for you. We will try to answer these questions and provide you with guidelines on how to select scientifically and statistically sound analyses without using unnecessary statistical jargon. The course is based on the open source software R that can be downloaded here.

In class we use RStudio, which is a productive user interface for R.

Note R is platform independent so it runs equally well on Window, Linux and Mac.

Documentation, manuals and textbooks are free and available in several languages; one of the best ones can be found in English or Spanish.



Travel Information

Taxi service from the Vancouver International Airport generally runs about \$35 CAD. Most taxis accept credit cards.


A low fare option for transportation to/from the airport is the SkyTrain Light Rail. Vancouver's SkyTrain is the oldest and one of the longest automated driverless light rapid transit systems in the world. The Expo and millennium SkyTrain Lines connect downtown Vancouver with the cities of Burnaby, New Westminster and Surrey. The Canada Line connects downtown Vancouver to the Vancouver International Airport (YVR) and the city of Richmond. It's roughly a 30 minute trip between the airport & Hyatt Regency and costs \$9 CAD (passes can be purchased at the SkyTrain station); the return trip is \$4 CAD - you will need to know that you are passing through two zones. The airport's website has information regarding where the train can be accessed; from there you get on the train at the YVR-Airport Station Eastbound to the Waterfront and get off at the City Center station, taking Georgia Street to Burrard Street, where the Hyatt Regency is located.

Driving Directions


• From Vancouver International Airport (YVR) 10 miles/16 kilometres): Take Grant McConnachie Way over the Arthur Lang Bridge. Exit Granville Street and proceed north (about 10 km). Turn left at 16th Avenue. Go down two blocks and turn right on Burrard Street. Proceed on Burrard and over Burrard Street Bridge to Georgia Street (10 blocks). Hyatt Regency Vancouver is on your left.



- From Seattle (approx 140 miles/225 kilometres): Proceed on I-5 through Peace Arch border crossing. Continue on Highway 99 on Canadian side and follow it for approximately 20 miles/35 kilometres through the municipalities of Surrey and then Richmond. Highway will turn into Oak Street Bridge and then Oak Street. Follow it to 49th Avenue and turn left. Go right on Granville Street and then follow instructions as above.
- From Eastern Suburbs: Exit Highway 1 at 1st Avenue. Hotel is approximately 6 miles/10 kms from exit. Follow 1st Avenue which at Clark Drive turns into Terminal Avenue. Follow Terminal Avenue and turn right on to Main Street. Stay on Main Street for 3 blocks and follow signs to downtown Vancouver. Exit left on to Dunsmuir Viaduct. Follow Dunsmuir past Rogers Arena, stay on Dunsmuir for approximately 10 blocks, and then turn left on Burrard Street. Hyatt Regency Vancouver is one block up on the right.
