• What is the current state of the committee's projects and activities?

- A draft of an innovations release aimed at weed control innovations based on a survey of weed scientists has been drafted and is scheduled to release sometime in Q1 2024.
- A release will be sent out in late January/early February for the upcoming National Invasive Species Awareness Week (NISAW) and the Western Society of Weed Science in late February/early March.
- There are several ideas that likely will be rolled out in 2024, such as the roll of uncontrolled management of invasive grasses on fueling firs and a common weed name review.
- Other more distant ideas are in the "parking lot" of each WSSA PAC agenda.
- We have compiled a list of potentially "evergreen" seasonal press releases previously issued. We are considering a plan to vet these older releases for accuracy and send a note to offer them up again to editors who might have missed them the first time around.

- Plan of Action:
 - Continue meeting every two weeks by teleconference to plan press releases, fact sheets and other public awareness initiatives.
 - Continue to increase our social media presence.
 - Continue to identify and act on emerging issues.
 - Engage with Herbicide Resistance Education Committee, GROW and with "Take Action" commodity group committees to align messaging related to herbicide resistant weeds.
 - Continue to work with Science Policy and Weed Loss committees to conduct national weed surveys.
